LOOP CREEK HELP MONITOR & REPORT MINE DISCHARGES

Please, help report silt discharges in Open Fork and Taylor Branch, major mine outlets, when you are fishing Loop Creek. <u>Take your camera and cell phone with you</u>. Call the DEP on the spot when you find Open Fork and/or Taylor Branch running dingy and Loop above Open Fork and/or Taylor Branch are clear. The Ist example is Open Fork and the 2nd is Taylor Branch.

This is particularly bad because Loop is up and fairly clear and the mine flow is bad! This type of contrast should be embarrassing to the people at the Mine. Open Fork is located about 50 yards below the Canterbury Road bridge in front of the first house. You can walk down to the creek here despite the signage, fishermen are welcome.

Several Chapter members met with the DEP in early September. At this meeting we were assured that the mine was making headway with their silt problems. Unfortunately, we continue to see problems. Sediment control structures are designed based on a certain amount of rainfall. The DEP must be at the discharge to sample it, if the problem is to be brought

to the mine's attention and put on record.

The KVCTU was on Loop this day doing the semiannual SOS. Situations like this need to be reported to the DEP as, in fact, it was. Taylor Branch is located about 100 yards below the Baptist Church on Missionary Church Road. A slip off the mine site is apparently causing silt releases. Hopefully Taylor will get better.

Hence, be prepared to contact the DEP when you are over on Loop Creek. The DEP inspector is Mark Burks and he will respond if we are timely. Email your pictures to him when you get home. Contact Mark and the DEP as follows:

MORRIS CREEK AND DARTMOUTH COLLEGE

ERNIE NESTER 3-18-2012



On March 16, 2012, I attended an event for Dartmouth College students that started around 8:30 AM at the Morris Creek Watershed Association (MCWA) Building. The 10 Dartmouth College students along with an advisor arrived at Mike King's house at 2:30 that morning. This event was organized by Mike King, Watershed Restoration Chair for the MCWA. Other folks attending the event included Jennifer Garlesky (DEP), Glenn Nelsen (DEP), John King (DEP), John Rebinski (DNR), Matt Earnest (Bridgemont), Deb Beutler (WVUIT) and Obi Henderson (VISTA for MCWA).

Glenn Nelsen gave instructions and demonstrations on how to test for pH and alkalinity. Later on the students checked the pH and alkalinity at three locations at each of the two main stem acid mine drainage treatment sites.

There is a culvert that carries mine water under the road and discharges into Morris Creek just below the Watershed Building. A lot of aluminum precipitates out shortly after this mine water mixes with the stream water. The pH of the water at the discharge was 3.5. Next the Dartmouth students shoveled some limestone sand at two locations into the ditch along the road that was carrying the mine water. After some of the limestone sand had reached

the stream the discharge was checked again and the pH was now about 7.0.

During lunch on the patio behind Mike king's house I presented a Kanawha Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited (KVCTU) Certificate of Appreciation to Mike King. The MCWA has done great work on Morris Creek including securing \$1.6 million grant to fight acid mine drainage, removing over 170 tons of trash from the watershed, building and erecting birdhouses, planting trees, and constructing several K-Dams to provide hiding places for trout. Trout can now live in most sections of Morris Creek which was a dead stream 10 years ago. Mike helps with the Trout in the Classroom (TIC) project at Pratt Elementary School and is very cooperative with the KVCTU on various projects.

After lunch we went to Pratt Elementary School to see their TIC operation. Jack Williams, Joe Crowder, and Brent Best met the group at the school. I did not count the number of Pratt students who are participating in the program, but there were a lot of students. Jack, Brent, and Joe explained the TIC program to the Dartmouth students and talked about the good work of the Pratt students.

This was the first leg of an energy tour for the Dartmouth students and they will tour several energy operations by the time the tour ends on March 20, 2012. Dartmouth College is located in Hanover, NH.
