# WV-VA WATER QUALITY MON-ITORING PROGRAM TRAINING

TU and its West Virginia and Virginia Councils are partnering with the

West Virginia Rivers Coalition (WVRC) to initiate a new volunteer water

quality monitoring program. The program will focus on training volunteers

to monitor coldwater resources in West Virginia and Virginia that have the

potential to be impacted by the increasing shale gas development.

The goals of the project are twofold. First, to educate volunteers about the potential impacts to fish and wildlife resources in the shale gas region of West Virginia and Virginia and train volunteers to effectively monitor the water quality in these areas. And second, to work with these trained volunteers to conduct water quality monitoring in all priority watersheds that have been identified by WVRC and TU's science team as critical for protecting ecologically significant lands and waters.

# A New Model for Fly Fishing Business In PA

As we slip into winter, many fly anglers start thinking about planning trips for the coming year; some considering places where their current West Virginia oriented gear doesn't really apply, such as the topics or Alaska. Their 8'6" 5 wt. just won't cut those conditions. So the typical option is to buy, or build, that 12wt and buy a large arbor reel with several spools for different fly lines....or use the well-worn gear provided by the guide, if they are using one.

Another option has appeared just north of us: gear rental. A fly shop in Pennsylvania will rent quality gear from rods & reels to waders and boots, and it's really quality gear. For example, rental fly rods include different models from Scott, Sage and Orvis. Reels include Abel, Lamson and Hatch. Patagonia and Simms boots and waders are available. One can also rent a complete outfit (rod, reel, waders & boots) selected for the type of fishing and the area, fresh or salt water for \$150 week. They will ship it to you or to the place you are going.

Further, this concept allows one to really test a new rod before buying one. A person may be interested in the new Sage One rod, or the Scott A4, or the Orvis Helios. Rather than putting out the big

bucks to buy one only to be happy with it, you can rent one and give it a good test drive in your home waters. The web site:
